Invitation to Two Information Presentations

Welcome New Parents and Guardians - if you are new to CCHS or CRPS please come to an information session on **September 13th** from 6pm to 7:00 pm in the school theatre to meet with Mr Rogers, Ms. Preece ,Mr. Holthuis and Ms. Janse (School Counselor) to hear more about our school and some of the communication tools we use between school and home. You will also be able to ask questions now that your child has experienced two weeks in their new school.

Grade 12 Graduation and Post Secondary Planning - if your child is in Grade 12 this year we will be hosting an information session on **September 13th** from 7-8pm in the school theatre. We encourage all parents and Grade 12 students to attend to hear about what the road to graduation from high school looks like over the next 10 months and how students and families should start to plan for post secondary education, training or employment.

School Council

Home Work Support Room

We have now restarted our Homework Support Room for our students.

Completion of classroom assigned work is crucial to a student's academic success. A zero given on an assignment because work is not completed is not a true assessment of student learning. To ensure true assessment of student learning, we believe it is important for students to complete classroom assigned work. To assist students in establishing successful study practices and understand the importance to their learning in completing assigned work, we will work with our students to help them complete missing assignments. Students who are not completing assigned work, will be asked by their teacher to attend a homework support room during lunch time to do any missing work. During this time, students will be given help in study skills and in completing the missed learning tasks. A failure to attend these study sessions will result in administrative contact with parents to pursue options to help the student successfully complete their work.

WimWE is an exciting opportunity to create deeper connections between students and our local wilderness, their peers, teachers, and ultimately themselves as well as learn outdoor activity and safety skills for participating in mountain recreation in all seasons. In partnership with the Canadian Rockies Outdoor Learning Centre and with generous funding from the Wim and Nancy Pauw Foundation, CRPS is excited to offer to all Grade 10 students in the division, the Wim & Nancy Pauw Wilderness Experience which offers some unique, challenging and powerful experiences for all of our Grade 10 students. Thank you Wim & Nancy Pauw Foundation for their ongoing support for all CRPS students and for their dedication to supporting meaningful outdoor learning opportunities for our youth.

It is the expectation that all Grade 10 students participate in this program as part of their program of studies at their respective high schools. There is no cost to families for this program.

CCHS in coordination with Canadian Rockies Outdoor Learning Centre teachers and instructors have provided the following outdoor activity days for your child:

~1 full day hiking @ Bankhead and C-Level Cirque Trail, Banff National Park

~Avalanche Skills Training 1 (AST 1): access to 5 online modules (due February 1, 2024), 1/2 classroom day, and 1 field day at Lake Louise Ski Resort to complete Avalanche Skills Training 1 certification (1 credit). Students are able to start working on the online modules now. Log-in information will be in the parent form.

~1 full day cross country skiing @ Great Divide Trail, Lake Louise

~1/2 day big boat canoeing @ Two Jack Lake, Banff National Park


