Reminder CCHS is a 1-1 School

CCHS is a 1-1 school, which means each student is required to have a computer for their classes. With over 550 students in our school, we do not have the resources to provide computers for each student. This means that each student must have their own computing device with them each day for classes. Note - a simple computer such as a Chromebook (~\$200) is more than capable of meeting the learning needs of your student. These machines are not only powerful enough to meet your student's learning needs, but also when fully charged before arriving at school will easily last the day.

You will note, that unlike many schools, our supply list does not give a long list of binders, pens, paper etc... as the computer is where your student will create their work. Our supply list is ... a

personal computing device. Many of our students use Chromebook type computers to do this work. The school has a very small number of computers to help students if their computer is being fixed or may run out of power during the day but we **do not** have enough to equip our students for daily use.

Dual Credit Courses with Olds College

High school students enrolled in this dual credit program take a post-secondary course that counts for 5 30-level (Grade 12) credits in high school *and* 3 post-secondary credits. They are dual enrolled and will receive a mark recorded on transcripts for each institution. These are first year Olds College courses that high school students are very successful in if they are motivated, independent learners who stay focused and complete all of the learning expectations set out by the instructor.

The deadline for registration is *September 14.* There is no fees for our students for these courses. Courses will run from *September 26th-December 16th*.
