National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

This year our focus at CCHS is related to the Call to Action #14 in the Truth and Reconciliation document, which focuses on a commitment to honouring Indigenous culture and language.

We will use Sept 26-29th, to serve as a launchpad for this commitment. During this week we will have a 30 second video (in daily announcement slides) introducing a new Stoney Nakoda Word each day.

Throughout the week we will have an Elders come speak with our students in their Humanities classes.. On Thursday September 29 we will have Orange Shirt Day and bring the school together for a Round Dance.

Home Work Support Room

We have now restarted our Homework Support Room for our Grade 9 and 10 students. As it has been a while since we have had this opportunity for students, please read the rationale for this program below.

Completion of classroom assigned work is crucial to a student's academic success. A zero given on an assignment because work is not completed is not a true assessment of student learning. To ensure true assessment of student learning, we believe it is important for students to complete classroom assigned work. To assist students in establishing successful study practices and understand the importance to their learning in completing assigned work, we will work with our Grade 9 & 10 students to help them complete missing assignments. Grade 9 & 10 students who are not completing assigned work will be asked by their teacher to attend a homework support room during lunch time to do any missing work. During this time, students will be given help in study skills and in completing the missed learning tasks. A failure to attend

these study sessions will result in administrative contact with parents to pursue options to help the student successfully complete their work.

This two-year program will provide you with a deep understanding of horticulture, including the production and management of plants, pests, landscapes, soils and water systems to achieve productive and sustainable systems.

HRT 1500 / TERM: FALL 2022

MANAGING LANDSCAPES

HRT 1500 is a foundational course in understanding the day-to-day career work of professional landscapers in Alberta. This course will introduce students to the theories, techniques, and processes that go into the planning and management of various landscape sites. You'll learn about the details of maintaining ornamental trees, shrubs, perennials, annuals and turf, what tools and techniques you need to know to get the job done, and how to plan your work tasks out efficiently.

High school students enrolled in this dual credit program take a post-secondary course that counts for 5 30-level (Grade 12) credits in high school *and* 3 post-secondary credits. They are dual enrolled and will receive a mark recorded on transcripts for each institution. These are first year Olds College courses that high school students are very successful in if they are motivated, independent learners who stay focused and complete all of the learning expectations set out by the instructor.

The deadline for registration is *September 14*. There is no fees for our students for these courses. Courses will run from *September 26th-December 16th*.

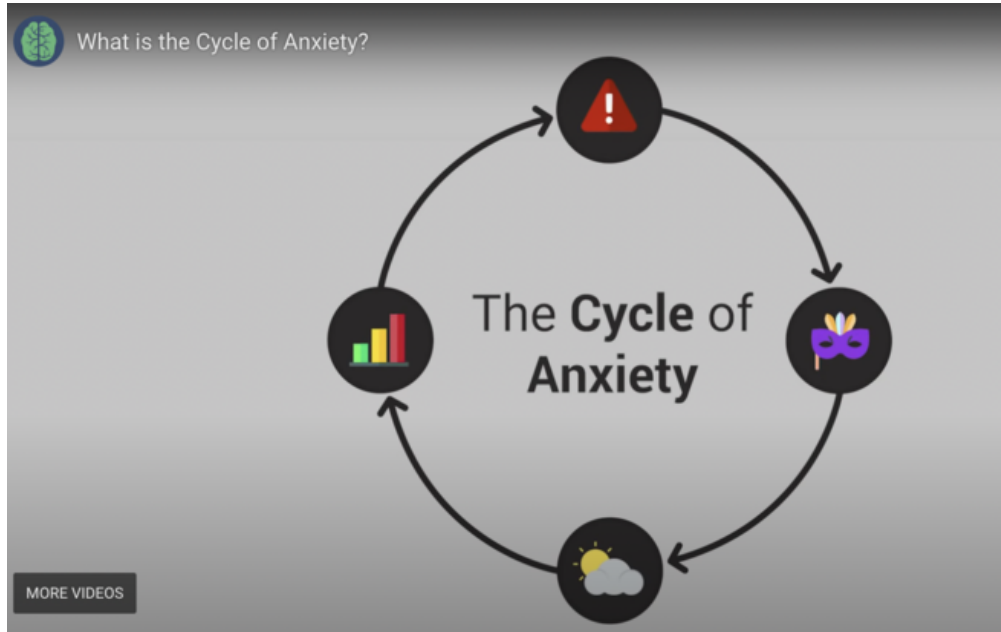
