Hello Families,

It was lovely to see our students participating in the Bus Safety session on Tuesday this week. Check in with your child about what they learned about how to safely ride the school bus. At Alpenglow we are working on a shared understanding of school behavior. All classes have discussed and had input into a matrix we are building that will allow our team to have shared language and expectations around behavior. We have centered our conversations around "I am safe", "I am kind" and "I am a learner". Ask your child to tell you what these each mean at Alpenglow. We will share the whole matrix with you after we finalize it with our students.

Truth and Reconciliation Monday October 7th 2024@ 1pm Back Field

Alpenglow will recognize Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day on October 7th at 1pm on our back field. In case of poor weather we will be in the theater. Parents are welcome to join us. We will welcome Eli Snow as our MC along with his drumming group. Some of our Indigenous students from CCHS and Alpenglow will be dancing to honor children lost to residential schools, the sixties scoop and other colonial policies in Canada. We thank them for sharing this special ceremony with us. The theme this year for Truth and Reconciliation is "Taking Truth to Action". Alpenglow administration has worked with our Indigenous Services Coordinator and the Knowledge Keepers who work with our Division to make the following year long commitments to reconciliation:

- **Explore and Teach:** Collaboration with Exshaw: Sharing Our Culture, Land and Language. Sharing expertise on and about the land in Exshaw and Canmore
- Recognize: Include Knowledge Keepers in preparing for collaboration sessions by positioning students as experts depending on the location of each session
- Teach/Understand: Library themed reading sessions and research writing focused on positioning Indigenous heroes as Canadian heroes
- Explore: Integrating Indigenous stories (Waldorf pedagogy) into traditional Alpenglow events (Stone Soup, OLC trips, Martinmas, Winterfest, Springfest, Candle dipping, felting, handwork)
- Take action: Teach basic lyarhe Nakoda words at each assembly and used them in classrooms throughout the month
