Smudging

As part of our ongoing journey of reconciliation, CCHS has visits from our division Knowledge Keepers. At times, and as part of a learning experience led by our Knowledge Keepers, students at Canmore Collegiate High School will have an opportunity to participate in a traditional smudge if they wish. A smudge involves burning a small amount of dried plant such as sage, tobacco, sweetgrass or cedar inside a cast-iron dish or abalone shell. During a smudge, participants sit in a circle and listen to the Elder/Knowledge Keeper/facilitator offer teachings about the practice and its role in historical and contemporary Indigenous communities. The smudge bowl may be passed around the circle as part of this traditional way of opening or beginning time together. Each year we inform our families of this and seek consent. Food for Learning Program

The Food for Learning Program is a voluntary program available to students of CCHS who are in financial need, and is made possible by a grant. The purpose of the program is to provide lunch to children of families who need <u>financial assistance</u> with the costs of school lunches. The program is intended to support only the children of families who are having *financial difficulty providing a nutritional, balanced lunch for their child*. Major Scholarship Application Deadline Approaching

Applications are currently open for the 2025 cohort of <u>Loran Scholars</u> — and university-bound students from Alberta are currently significantly under-represented in our applicant pool. This year, 36 Loran Awards will be offered to university-bound students from across Canada who demonstrate strength of character, a deep commitment to service, and intrinsic leadership potential. Presently, there are 14 exceptional Loran Scholars who hail from Alberta. You can filter by home province—read about them here.

The only scholarship of its kind in Canada, the Loran Award offers a four-year leadership-enrichment program, financial support for undergrad, diverse opportunities for experiential learning, and a long-term supportive community of peers and mentors, renewable over four years of university undergraduate studies.
