Bike Safety

The Positive Ticket campaign will begin shortly. Peace Officers and RCMP Members will be handing out positive tickets for safe cycling behaviour which comes with prizing.

Peace Officers have noticed that a number of students are cycling around town without their helmets on. Often, they have their helmets either hanging off their bag or bike. According to the Traffic Safety Act, **it is legally required for anyone under the age of 18 to wear a helmet while riding their bicycle or while riding as a passenger on a bicycle.**
