CRPS High School implementation 2025-2026



Why?

- ★ Data stronger sense of belonging
- ★ Data adult advocate at school
- ★ Feedback from our surveys (parent/teacher/student) and Community Engagement Network
- ★ Universal Mental Health support student well-being and a desire from parents for this type of support
- ★ Course planning, study skills and academic support
- ★ Importance of postsecondary and career preparation

What does this look like?

- ★ Cross-grade groupings
- ★ School wide 'curriculum' designed by CCHS/BCHS staff using input from students, parents and teachers
- ★ Teacher led with a view to students taking on leadership roles as the program grows
- ★ Social Emotional skills (stress/anxiety management/upstander community/kindness/ compassion/inclusion/belonging/connection with an adult advocate)
- ★ Study skills/Exam preparation
- ★ School administration (course changes, surveys, sharing of information)
- ★ Career and Postsecondary preparation (Digital Portfolio upkeep, review information and prepare for postsecondary fairs, career fairs, career exploration, post secondary research and applications, goal setting, grade review, academic planning)
- ★ Community Contributions (Citizenship)
- ★ Cultural and Community Connections (celebrations)
- ★ Community building

How?

- ★ 30 mins during each Monday, Wednesday and full-day Friday
- ★ Embedded between A and B block
- ★ Attendance taken
- ★ Mandatory for all students unless completing RAP during A <u>and</u> B block OR Grade 12's who have a spare in <u>BOTH</u> A and B blocks

What Changes in Grade 10?

- If you don't pass a class you now have to take it again, you can't progress to the next level without passing the grade 10 level (switching up between streams is possible but requires course planning and usually an extra course)
- One big change is courses now count for credits. You will need 100 credits to graduate with a Diploma or 80 credits for a Certificate of Achievement.
 - Begin to plan your high school path carefully. The path you take will help guide you on your way to University, College, a Trade or the workplace.

Humanities 10 English 20 Social Studies 20


Humanities 10 (regular High School Program)

- Grade 10 students will have a Humanities teacher who will teach them Language Arts and Social Studies over the course of the full year and will receive a mark for each subject separately.
- Through this approach students will cover the learner outcomes for Language Arts 10 (-1 or -2) and Social Studies 10 (-1 or -2) over the course of the year.
- English 20-1 or -2, Social 20-1 or -2 taught separately, one semester each

STEM Grade 10 Math, Science, Bio, Chem, Physics 20

STEM 9 (Science Technology Engineering and Math) (English/French)


- Grade 10 students have a STEM teacher who will teach them Mathematics 10C or 10-3 and Science 10 or 14 over the course of the full year and will receive a mark for each subject separately. We also have Math 15/10C more info next slide.
- Grade 11 students will take either Math 20-1, -2 or -3
- Grade 11 students will take either Science 24, Science 20, Bio 20, Chem 20 or Physics 20



Math @ CCHS



- daily review/practice for a minimum of 15 mins
- pre assessment on grade 9 outcomes prior to each concept this year
- one year's growth plan for students who are not successful with the previous years outcomes
- clear communication with parents at parent student teacher conferences
- Support from counselor built into approach in class for growth mindset and math confidence
- Opportunity to join Math 15/10C until Sept 19th



Math 15/10C

- The CCHS administration and grade 10 math teacher team provides an opportunity to take our Math 15/10C course this current semester,
- Will provide a pathway to the Math 20-2 course in grade 11.
- This is for students who are motivated to complete Math 10C but are struggling with the course.
- <u>Deadline is apply to switch to this class is Sept</u>
 <u>19th.</u> Contact current math teacher to discuss first.



Math 15 (3 credit course)

Math 15 focuses on improving student mastery of mathematical skills and concepts in preparation for Math 10C.

The course focuses on strengthening student skills in vocabulary, numeracy, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills. The lessons and assessments are designed so that students can learn and demonstrate mathematical knowledge that is requisite for higher level math courses.



Math 10C (5 credit course)

With the remaining time in the course our students will learn any essential Math 10C learner outcomes not covered in the Math 15 course, so they are well prepared to challenge the Math 10C exam and have a solid foundation for success in Math 20-2.








WimWE Program Goals

 - Trip to Paris, France @spring break (plan is to offer every second year for students currently in FLA 10, 20 or 30)





School Council MISSION STATEMENT


The mission of the School Council is to support the diverse school community by ensuring information is communicated in a clear, transparent and respectful manner.
