



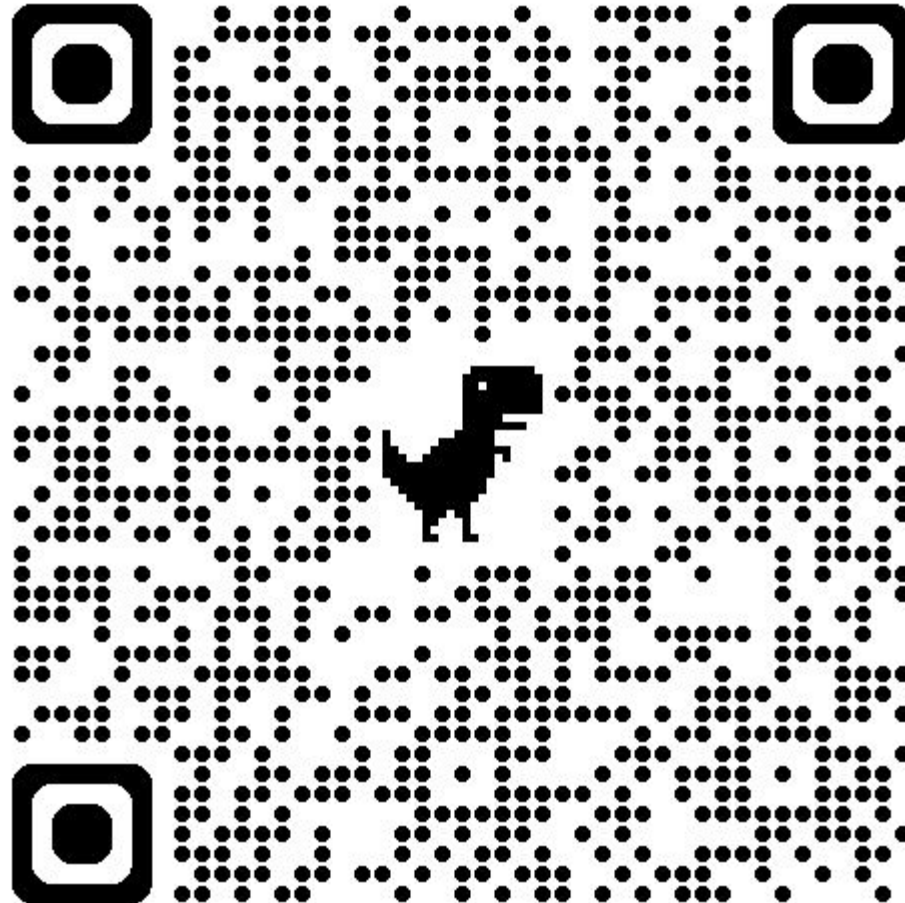

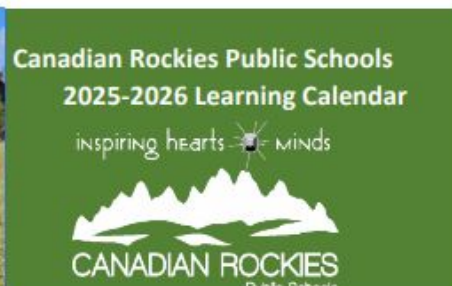

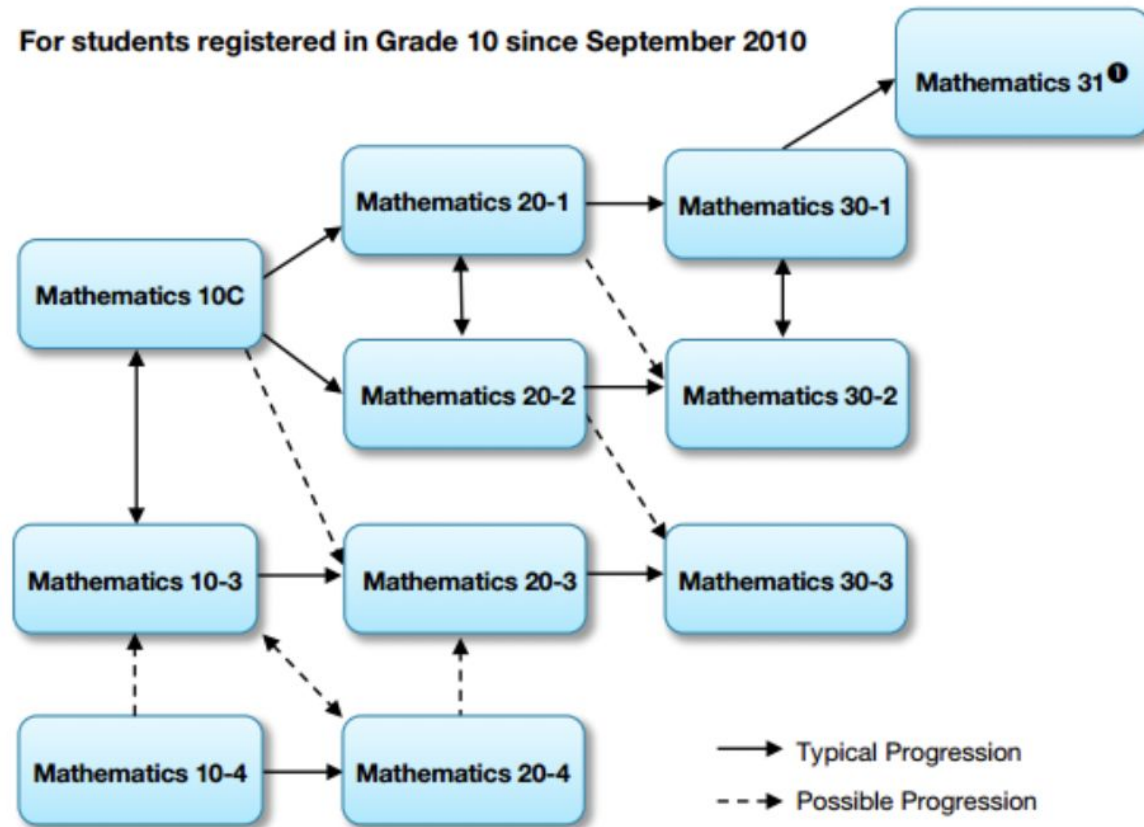

Possible Sequences — Mathematics Course Sequences

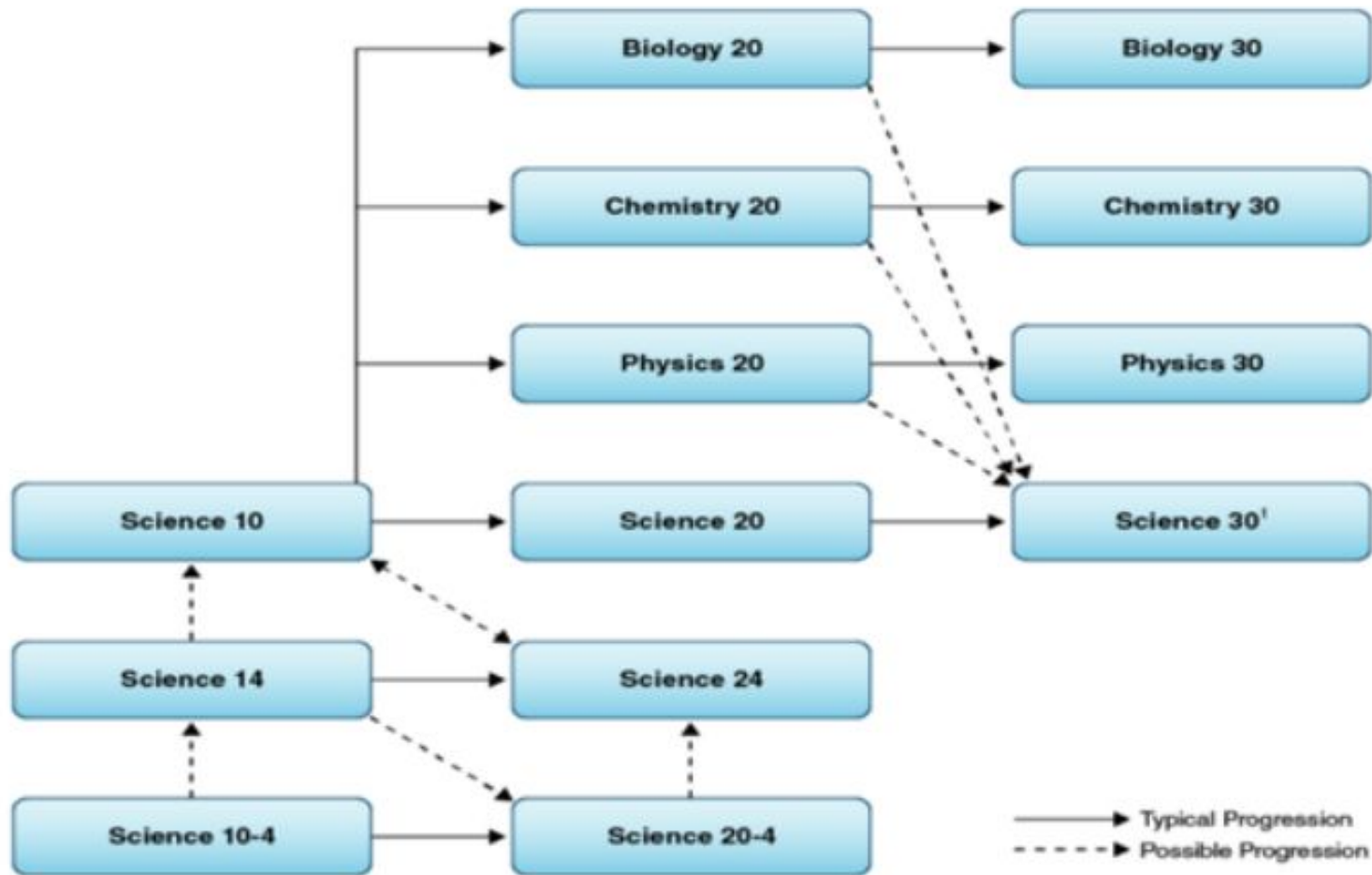

Scholarships

A scholarship is an **award of financial aid for a student to further education**. ... Grants are funds disbursed by one party (Grant Makers), often a Government Department, Corporation, Foundation or Trust, to a recipient, often (but not always) a nonprofit entity, educational institution, business or an individual.



Bursary

Bursary: A non-repayable grant of money, Bursaries are awarded primarily **based on financial need**, but academic achievement is also considered. Usually, the applicant must provide detailed documentation describing their financial situation when applying for the bursary

Grants

Most types of [grants](#), unlike loans, are **sources of free money that generally do not have to be repaid**. Grants can come from the federal government, your state government, your college or career school, or a private or nonprofit organization.

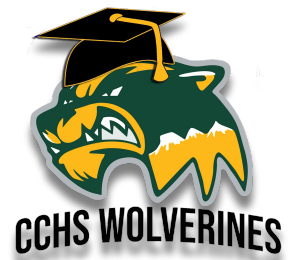
To qualify for a Canada Student Grant and/or [Loan](#) you must

- be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident of Canada or designated as a protected person;
- be a permanent resident of a province or territory that issues Canada Student Grants and/or Loans; and
- demonstrate financial need.
